Guidelines for Team & Singles Entry & Tournament Play

- 1) All players must be 21 years of age and have played together on the same team in a sanctioned league. Each player must have played a minimum of 6 weeks on one team at time of entry. All players must have picture I.D. with them at the tournament.
- 2) A team may use up to six regular players for the state tournament (all from the same team), knowing that the team will be classed by the statistics of the five best players.
- 3) Teams competing in team tournament must have 3 original members and subs must come from the same league as team.
- 4) Team will be one Division Handicapped.
- 5) Tournament director reserves the right to rule on cases on extenuating circumstances.
- 6) Any team forfeiting a game for any reason during tournament play will be dropped from tournament. Round Robin matches will be re-scored accordingly. Double elimination will forfeit remaining matches. Players on that team will be restricted from playing in the following years tournament.
- 7) Any players/teams expelled from the tournament for any reason will not be eligible for any refunds or prize money. All players on that team will be restricted from playing in the following years tournament.
- 8) Team captains are in charge of registration. Any team caught using an illegal player will forfeit all matches. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- 9) Women Masters must play in level 2.

Singles

Level 3 singles: Race to 2 on the winners side / Race to 2 on the loser side. The break will be determined as follows: **Coin Flip/Alternate....** Rack your own break.

Level 2 singles: Race to 3 on both sides to the finish. The break will be determined as follows: **Coin Flip/Alternate....** Rack your own break.

Level 1 singles: Race to 4 on both sides to the finish. The break will be determined as follows: **Coin Flip/Alternate....** Rack your own break.

Ladies singles: Race to 2 on both sides to the finish. The break will be determined as follows: Coin Flip/Alternate.... Rack your own break.

Team

We will have one handicapped level of play. You will play a 20 game score sheet. Each team has a handicap total... subtract the team handicap totals, the team with the higher handicap gets the difference added to their points the first round. A coin flip will determine who is the home team.

- In the event of a tie, replay the first match to determine the winner
- Any disagreements on a score sheet, the home teams score will be used.

General Information

All VNEA rules will apply, exceptions – the patch does not need to be used and an Eight Ball in on the break is a re-rack.

If you break your Que down and turn your back on the table you forfeit your match.

Spectators and inactive players should be respectful of matches in progress at all times.

Proper Behavior

Proper behavior, conduct and sportsmanship are required at all times. Decisions made by the Tournament Officials on disputes are FINAL. No physical contact or intent to harm other players or spectators is allowed on the tournament floor. In the event this occurs you will be disqualified from the tournament. No outside beverages will be allowed in the tournament area.

Damage to Property

Any damage to property in the tournament area will be the sole responsibility of the parties involved. (Full Cash Value) this includes disqualification from the tournament.

Cheating

Player(s) caught cheating will be penalized, including, but not limited to immediate ejection from the tournament and / or suspension from future MTA Pool Tournaments for a length of time to be determined by the MTA Tournament Director.

The Tournament Director has the right to make any changes he/she feels necessary to brackets and may ask any player to leave the tournament at any time.
